Managing your waste

Veolia Environmental Services is helping Nottinghamshire County Council to manage its waste for the next 26 years. To manage waste in an environmentally sound and efficient way that meets legislation requirements, Veolia Environmental Services will put the following actions into practice:

- Encourage waste reduction through education.
- Assist the County Council to increase recycling to 52% by 2020.
- Improve Household Waste Recycling Centres in the county.
- Build a Materials Recovery Facility to sort recyclable material collected from households.
- Establish a composting facility to recycle garden waste.
- Build an Energy Recovery Facility (ERF) to treat approximately 180,000 tonnes of waste a year. The facility will produce up to 15MW of electrical energy, enough to power up to 15,000 homes.
- Significantly reduce the amount of waste going to landfill.



What does all this mean to YOU?

A potential site for the proposed Energy Recovery Facility

Rufford Colliery in Rainworth has been selected as a potential site for the Energy Recovery Facility (ERF) which will serve central and north Nottinghamshire. We feel this site is appropriate because:

- It is situated close to where waste is generated.
- There are excellent transport links to the site.
- The District Council who collect waste don't have to travel far from their borders to deliver to the facility.
- Rufford has a history of resource recovery and waste management.

A planning application will be submitted in late 2007. If our application is successful, construction on the site is planned to commence in 2008. The proposed facility would be operational by the end of 2011.

Do you want to play a part in shaping the future of the development?

As potential neighbours of the proposed development we want to discuss our plans with you and hear your views to help shape the future of the facility.

To do this we propose to establish an Energy Recovery Liaison Group made up of members from the local area and from other organisations that have an interest in the area and the process. We are writing to you and your neighbours to find out if you would like to join the group.

Why should you join?

As a member of the group, you will get the opportunity to find out what is happening in your neighbourhood; discover why we need to establish an Energy Recovery Facility; discuss the issues with experts and your neighbours; raise any concerns; influence some elements of the design and ultimately, the way in which we report back about the operation of the facility.

How do you join?

We are looking for approximately 25 people to join the group from across the community. It is hoped that the group would meet quarterly in the Rainworth area. As a group you will decide your constitution and the issues you want to discuss.
